Back Range Rules

These are special rules for people who are authorized by the Custer Sportsmen's Club IPSC, Cowboy, Bowling Pin, Speed Steel, Bianchi, Tactical Rifle, and Falling Plates Chairmen. These rules are an addition to the RANGE USER SAFETY AGREEMENT and standard safe gun handling. You must purchase a Range Pass for \$35.00.

- **You may shoot only the discipline for which you have been authorized by the discipline Chairman, e.g. if you are authorized to shoot bowling pin then you cannot shoot IPSC or Cowboy style shooting without the additional authorization.**
- **You must be an active shooter in one of the disciplines mentioned above.**
- **You must be a current member in good standing.**
- **You must have your range pass in your possession, better to have it displayed on your person or range bag.**
- **It is recommended that you and a minimum of 1 other person be there.**
- **Do not use Bay 9 (bay with the dark house and mover) without authorization from the CRO – it is leased to Customs and Border Protection for training.**
- **Bays that are set up for a match and have been roped off, or have a bay closed sign, are “off limits” to all members unless you have specific approval from the match director.**
- **If there is an organized match on you must ask permission from the match director if it's ok to practice; he will direct you to the proper bay.**
- **Safety areas must be used to bag and un-bag your gun.**
- **You cannot leave the firing line with a loaded gun, unless engaging targets.**
- **High powered rifle: there must be at least 2 people present & one person must be a certified Range Officer. Engaging steel targets with high powered rifle is not allowed.**
- **Only approved targets can be used, used targets are available.**
- **Engagement of Steel Target: DO NOT engage non-stationary steel targets (hinged at their base, such as poppers, or falling plates) with two successive shots (double taps) with ANY form of ammunition shot from any type of firearm.**
- **DO NOT engage steel target unless placed at least 10 yards from the muzzle of the firearm. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that steel targets approved for high power rifle must be engaged at least 100 yards from the muzzle of the high-powered rifle.**
- **DO NOT place steel targets to be engaged with rifle or pistol more than 10 feet from the berm.**
- **APPROVED AMMUNITION FOR STEEL TARGETS: Unless specifically approved by a match director or range officer, steel targets may only be engaged with the following types of ammunition.**
 - **RIFLE & PISTOL; pistol caliber ammunition only with a maximum power factor of 150, unless otherwise permitted by and under supervision of a discipline chair, match director, or range officer, or during unsupervised practice sessions where the shooter knows for sure that subject steel targets are capable of withstanding bullet impacts without surface or other damage. Rule of thumb; if in doubt, DON'T DO IT. The shooter is responsible for any damage resulting from his or her failure to properly identify the type of steel. To determine the power factor of your ammunition, multiply the bullet weight in grains by the muzzle velocity in feet per second, then divide that result by 1000. Example: if your bullet weighs 180 grains and its muzzle velocity is 800 feet per second its power factor is 144 (180x800)/1000.**
 - **SHOTGUN: LEAD SHOT ONLY of size 6 or smaller, using standard loads only; with a maximum muzzle velocity of 1500 feet per second.**
 - **DO NOT USE ANY OTHER FORMS OF AMMUNITION ON STEEL TARGET; provided however, that particular steel targets (such as armor plate) may be approved for use by high-powered rifle, at the**

direction of the discipline chair, match director, or range master. A violation of any of the ammunition restrictions will result in loss of back range access.

- Watch your 180, and your finger must be outside the trigger guard unless engaging targets.
- Shooting props is not allowed; props are not target holders.
- Always know where your round is going, all rounds must impact the berm.
- No one can move down range until the shooter has unloaded and holstered or bagged his or her gun.
- You may not give firearms training for hire or reward, unless prior approval has been granted by the Board.
- You are responsible for the safety and conduct of any and all shooters that you bring to the range. If you are with a new shooter make sure you control him or her, don't assume that they know how to shoot safely.
- You must clean up after yourself, don't leave a mess for the next person; there are trash barrels provided in each bay.
- Everyone, including bystanders must wear eye and ear protection.
- The Custer Sportsmen's Club BOD and CRO have total and complete authority over the handling and discharge of all firearms, and the conduct of all persons on the premises. Failure to abide by these rules and by any commands issued by the CRO or a member of the BOD will result in you being escorted off the premises. You may also lose your back range shooting privileges.
