Custer Sportsmen's Club Range Use Rules

1. Shooting hours for members on Outdoor Ranges are between 9:00 A.M. and 9:00 P.M., or dusk; whichever comes first. Non-members are welcome, but must be accompanied by a member.
2. Immediately upon arrival at the range, all shooters must sign in and pay any range fees **BEFORE** they begin shooting (this will be monitored by the Chief Range Officer). Upon leaving shooters must clean-up after themselves; remove any targets they have placed; close and lock gates.
3. **ALL SHOTS** on the rifle and pistol ranges must **IMPACT** the berm. To make sure this rule is met; all targets must be mounted on target boards provided by the club. Homemade target holders, boxes, cans, water jugs, or other types of targets are not acceptable targets. Any exception to this must be approved by the Chief Range Officer. Shotguns using anything other than slugs may not be fired at the target boards. Pattern testing with a shotgun may be done using cardboard mounted against a berm. **DO NOT SHOOT** the framework for the target boards or signs posted on said framework. **DO NOT SHOOT** any of the concrete fixtures; or steel sheets covering the silhouette bays.
4. **NO RAPID FIRE** (one second and faster) unless authorized by Range Officer.
5. Treat all firearms as if they are loaded. Keep muzzles pointed in a safe direction.
6. Firearms must be in a safe condition at all times; except during firing. This means actions open, magazines out, lay the firearm down with the ejection port facing up, and pointed down range. Exceptions to this are firearms in a case; standing upright in a rifle rack, or while actions are disabled for cleaning purposes. Firearms should only be loaded when they are in the shooters hands or on their shoulders.
7. Custer is a cold range; this means all areas of the range, including parking lots and buildings; firearms must be unloaded safely at the firing line. For members that have a Concealed Carry Permit you may reload your firearm safely at the firing line, holster it then you must to proceed to your automobile and leave the range. Pistols are not to be carried loaded in a holster (except law enforcement on duty, and approved range officers). Drawing from the holster is prohibited unless the shooter is a known IPSC or Cowboy Action competitor, or law enforcement personnel; please check with the Chief Range Officer before you start shooting.
8. The firing line is off limits to anyone who has consumed any substance that may adversely affect their actions and/or safety awareness. This includes; but is not limited to alcohol and prescription drugs.
9. The IPSC bays are not open to the general membership. Approval to use these ranges must be granted by one of the Discipline Chairman's who uses these bays. When using the back range it is recommended that two adults be present.

10. The indoor range is not open to the general membership; it is reserved for competition and group activities. Approval to use the indoor range must be granted by one of the Discipline Chairmen who use this range/the Chief Range Officer or the General Officer. Ammunition restrictions do apply on this range; and shotguns and center fire rifles are prohibited. When handling any firearm at any time whether you're shooting or cleaning it; you must be inside the indoor range and muzzles pointing down range.
11. Obey all range commands instantly.
12. Never touch another shooter when they are firing; and do not distract them from their shooting.
13. Do not touch another shooters equipment without permission.
14. Check with other shooters to make sure the firing line is safe before going down range for any reason.
15. When the firing line is cold all shooters must make their guns safe; this means actions open; magazines out; and gun pointed down range; you **CAN NOT** touch your gun until the all clear is given and the range is HOT. The only exception to this rule is a shooter repairing or cleaning his gun at the safety table **ONLY** where the gun is already disabled and cannot fire.
16. It is recommended that you do not eat or drink anything while shooting, if you do you should use the guest building or your car, and it is highly recommended that you wash your hands well with warm soapy water before consuming anything.
17. Food and drink are **PROHIBITED** in the indoor range at any time.
18. Violations of these rules should be reported to the Chief Range Office; or a Board Member.
19. All board members and the CRO have complete authority over all persons at the range, and all commands given by them must be obeyed.
20. Violations of these rules can be grounds for immediate removal from the range; and will be reviewed by the Executive Board and may result in the loss of membership and banishment from the range.
