

CUSTER SPORTSMENS CLUB YOUTH SHOOTING POLICY

Custer Sportsmen's Club has implemented a written policy to address the real and/or potential safety and hygiene concerns and liabilities associated with group youth shooting at Custer Sportsmen's Club.

We want to do our best to ensure that all coaches and event leaders that have youth attendance understand their responsibility to ensure they have an adequate number of adults present to provide safety and supervision when a group of youth shooters is under their responsibility. We would require a 1 to 5 ratio of adult to youth. Exceptions must be cleared by the CSC executive committee.

Groups that will be covered under this will be all junior shooting teams, all Custer Sportsmen's Club events monthly and major, and all outside parties that rent Custer Sportsmen's Club facilities for parties or training that involve firearms, paint-ball guns or air guns.

Events will include monthly matches, major matches, training sessions, and other group events.

It is incumbent on the Coach or person in charge to determine to what extent his shooters are trained and understand firearm safety and hygiene.

Private parties outside of Custer Sportsmen's Club must notify the President, Vice President or CEO of their intent to use Custer Sportsmen's Club facilities for firearm training or events. (This can be done through the Chief Range Officer).

Custer Sportsmen's Club Chief Range Officer or his trained representative will do a lead wipe down and testing of the shooting tables and area the day of the indoor range rental to nonmember groups.

At a minimum, 3 of the 5 members of the Executive Board will have a conversation about the event and those executive members will communicate with the individual in charge of the event to address concerns and specify safety and hygiene requirements.

All Custer Sportsmen's Club discipline heads and Head Coaches will be reminded of the safety and hygiene needs on an annual basis.
